You will build strong vocabulary, conjugate verbs in present and future tense, make negative sentences, understand feminine/masculine and singular/plural, express wishes, obligations, tastes, and preferences, etc. Emphasis is put on **communication**. This course covers the Preliminary lesson and Work Units 1 to 9 of the textbook.
